HIST1003 History of Revolution and Ataturk's Principles I

2+0+0 ECTS:2

Contents of the Course

Revolution and similar concepts, the reasons for the collapse of the Ottoman Empire, World War I, the reasons for the establishment of the Republic of Turkey, the national awakening that began with the Armistice of Mudros and the subsequent occupation of Anatolia, Atatürk's personality and his landing in Samsun, the preparatory period for the War of Independence (congresses, the opening of the Turkish Grand National Assembly) and the period of wars, the abolition of the Sultanate, the Treaty of Lausanne, and the proclamation of the Republic are explained and comprehended. Providing accurate information about Atatürk's revolutions and the Atatürkist thought system, as well as the history of the Republic of Türkiye, helps Turkish youth grow in line with the Atatürkist thought system.

Contents of the Course

INTR1003

Political History - I

3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

This course will offer an overview of political history of the world starting from the 17th century till the end of the Second World War. The focus of the class is the European region and great powers. The course would emphasise certain events in history; The Thirty Years? War, the French Revolutionary and Napoleonic Wars, the Wars of German Unification, and the two world wars of the 20th century.

INTR1005

Introduction to Law

3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

The contents of this course include; the characteristics of legal rules and the sources of knowledge for law, the differentiation of legal rules, contemporary legal systems, sanctions and types of sanctions, public law, private law, mixed law branches and subdivisions, responsibility and accountability, the legal infrastructure, such as the judicial organization and the function, legal organization and function.

Contents of the Course



This course provides students with a basic knowledge of what economics is and how it works. The course is designed for students who are outside the field of economics but need a simple understanding of it in their own research fields. Half of the course is devoted for microeconomics while another half is for macroeconomics.

Integrative Principles.

INTR1000

Introduction to International Relations

3+0+0 ECTS:6

In this global era, it is critical that all citizens understand how the world works. This introduction to international relations course eschews most of the theory, which tends to be too abstract and divorced from the way the world actually operates. Instead, it focuses on history, regions of the world, globalization and global challenges, and world order to provide readers with the essential background and building blocks necessary to make sense of this complicated and interconnected world. In short, this course will make students more globally literate, which is a must in this global era, as what goes on outside a country matters enormously to what happens inside. Even if we want to ignore the world, it will not ignore us. The choice we face is how to respond. We are connected to this world in all sorts of ways. We need to better understand it, both its promise and its threats, in order to make informed choices, be it as students, citizens, voters, parents, employees, or investors.

INTR1002 Political History - II 3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

Being one of the oldest science branches in the world, history discipline always attracted attention during human story. It is meaningless to tackle with the so called debate ?whether history repeats itself or not? instead one should focus on human being who always main actor of historical developments and under similar conditions repeats his/her acts. Edward H. Carr in his book he searches answer of the question ?what is history?? after long debate decides that ?history is objectively transfer of events to next generations?. Ibni Khaldun in his famous book Mukaddime says that history is a kind of action towards to analyze historical events from cause and effect relation perspective. Turkkaya Ataov in his book Respond to Blue Book, criticizes orientalist historiography underlines similar views with Khaldun. Under this context, IR and Public Adm. students so far who studied World History, Ottoman History and European Political History needs to learn contemporary historical developments also which most of them are the causes of current conflicts or issues. During Political History course starting from mid-19th century world events including Ottoman modernization and fall, foundation of Modern Turkish Republic will be tackled with.

INTR1004 Introduction to Human Geography

It introduces students to major traditions, themes, and theories of human geography by focusing on the patterns and processes of globalization and the interdependence of people and places around the world.

INTR2001

International Law I

3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

History of international law; sources; legal characteristics of international actors; privileges and immunities; international maritime law, conflict law, human rights, etc. Topics will be covered in class.

INTR2003

International Relations Theories

3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

The course is designed and constructed to introduce leading theoretical approaches and major theoretical and methodological debates in the field of international relations. Basic theoretical approaches such as realism, liberalism, international society, social constructivism, Marxist approaches will be examined

and key methodological discussions will be introduced. During the course, important international current developments are tried to be explained and analyzed through analytical perspectives. Students studying this course should be able to compare theoretical approaches in International Relations and show the similarities and differences between them.

INTR2005 History of Political Thought

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

This course introduces students with main strands of political thought both in Europe and beyond Europe. The course delves into one ideology in each week and teaches students each ideology with its historical context and specific meaning for International Relations (IR). Throughout the end, the course moves beyond the political ideologies that have marked the European history and visits the so-called other political ideologies underpinned histories of India, the Middle East, and Africa.

INTR2007 World History - I 3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

This course covers all of human history from the emergence of humanity to the 1500s. It will be studied the history of major world cultures, and empires of world history. This course will also handle larger themes in world history, such as trade, the development of technology, the spread of religions, and the historical relationship between societies.

INTR2009 Nationalism and World Politics 3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

A central goal of liberal arts education is to enable students to acquire international awareness and become a citizen of the world community, and political, social and cultural movements rooted in conceptions of ethnicity or nationhood have undeniably shaped, and is continuously shaping, the modern world that we live in. This course focuses on the role of ethnic communities and nations within the domestic politics of sovereign states. It will introduce students to concepts and definitions of ethnicity and nationalism, and explore the historical and contemporary basis for their development and significance. It will also examine some exemplar research that will guide us to understand these phenomena better. Conflicts generated by nationalist demands for political recognition, and how states deal with them, will be discussed. This course will conclude with an investigation into the controversial issue of intervention by other states and international organizations in ethnic conflicts within sovereign states.

INTR2011 Public Diplomacy 3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course covers the goals, methods and limitations of public diplomacy and provides an understanding of the theoretical foundations and different dynamics of public diplomacy.

Students will explore the fundamental concepts, theories and paradigms of international relations. Among these are the International System, International Law, International Politics, Sovereignty, Balance of Power, Realism, Liberalism, Power, and Power theory in the target language. Students will have the chance to review the basics of the field both spoken and written with the help of the related papers in English.

INTR2000

International Law - II

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

The history of international law; sources; legal characteristics of international actors; privileges and immunities; international maritime law, law of conflict, human rights, etc. will be covered in the course.

INTR2002 Geopolitics of the Black Sea Region

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

This course is grounded in regionalism. Within this context, the concept of region, regional security, and social and economic regionalism will be explored. Furthermore, the relations between countries in the Black Sea Basin, a region in which Türkiye is located, will be examined.

INTR2004

Turkish Political History

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

Since the middle of the 20th century, attention has somewhat shifted to discussing democracy problems. Conventionally, however, the dominant approach has still been centered on how to establish and sustain democratic values, institutions, and safeguards for individual rights against the legacy of the state-dominant single party authoritarianism and the secularism imperative. The undying legacies of the modern ?Leviathan?, the Turkish state, has been assumed to lead to exclusion, essentializing, marginalization, and militarization of non-state actors. The end result is the emasculation of democracy. An extension of this stand is that the ?enlightened? agenda of Turkey?s modernizing elite is threatened by the ?resistance? of the excluded. Under this context, IR and Public Adm. students so far who studied World History, Ottoman History and European Political History needs to learn contemporary historical developments also which most of them are the causes of current conflicts or issues. During Political History course starting from mid-19th century world events including Ottoman modernization and fall, foundation of Modern Turkish Republic will be tackled with.

INTR2006

World History - II



This course offers an intellectual and cultural assessment of the development, interaction, and significance of world civilizations from the 1500s to the end of World War I.

Asia-Pacific Politics

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

Asia Pacific region, geography, current state of affairs, politics of China, Indonesia, Southeast Asia, South Asia, Northeast Asia, and the Pacific.

INTR2010

Introduction to Comparative Politics

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course aims to analyze the development of the Comparative Politics field and therefore will cover the following topics: Methods in comparative politics, regime types, democracies and other systems, regime change, political culture, political parties and party systems, elections and electoral systems, government types, lobby groups.

INTR2012

Balkan Politics

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

Balkan History, Balkan nations, and the root of the problems by relating to past. Geographical and demographic characteristics of the Balkans, current regional actors, issues, and developments.

INTR2014

Contents of the Course

Contents of the Course

Project and program concepts, introduction of organizations and support mechanisms that provide project support, such as Development Agency-KOSGEB-TÜBİTAK, framework programs, etc., analysis of project originality, locational factors, risk analysis, priority area analysis, NACE Codes, introduction of the professional consultancy sector, emerging trends, discussion of the concept of sustainability, project cycle management and the logical framework approach in this context, the concept of grant, support agreement, analysis and planning stages, current situation analysis,

INTR3001

Turkish Foreign Policy - I

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

Turkish Foreign Policy (TFP-I) starts from the last century of Ottoman Empire. Especially beginning from Abdulhamit II?s reign (1876-1909) TFP has tracked a balance policy considering conflicting interests of big powers. It could be said that balance policy provided survival of collapsing Ottoman Empire for a while. During the rule of Ittihat Terakki, Union and Progress (UPP) (1909-1918) traditional had some grave changes but during and after National Struggle it again based on its long-lasting balance policy. During Republican era except annexation of Hatay (1939) and two Peace Operations to Cyprus (July, August 1974) TFP continued to track its traditions policy making method. After the collapse of Ottoman Empire the transformation into a national state brought some grave problems and TFP inevitably closely has been affected by that developments. Because of said reasons TFP is not a story of success neither during the last century of Ottoman Empire nor during the Republican era. Challenges, incapability, difficulties, historical ties (Balkans and Middle East) and Turkish legacy all around the world are the basic problems TFP makers should cope with. TFP makers, bearing in mind that difficulties try to implement a policy which will make Turkey an international actor. In this Class: basic concepts of foreign policy will be underlined, with a critical viewing will be evaluated. Freedom of speech is the basic of the class and the period 1912-1980 will be the main time span that would be tackled with. Thus analytical skills of undergraduate student will be focused on.

INTR3003

International Political Economy

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

This course will provide students with a foundational understanding of theoretical approaches to international political economy, key actors in the global economy, and current international economic issues affecting social, economic, and political life.

INTR3005

International Organisations

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course focuses on the emergence and development of the very idea of international organisation in the context of international organisations that have important positions in the international system such as the UN, Bretton Woods institutions, the EU, NATO, Shanghai Cooperation Organisation, Amnesty International, etc.

INTR3007

Dip. Writ. and Spea. Tech. In English - I

This course combines core academic concepts with applied classroom component to help students understand the challenges of diplomacy in an ever-changing and globalizing world. The structure of the course incorporates theoretical sessions with in-class activities. The first part of the course covers the diplomatic theory including the origins of diplomacy, the general categorisation of diplomacy, the frameworks of norms and laws, and personal/professional ethics. The second aspect of the course employs in-class tasks to develop students' skills to communicate both orally and written in diplomatic language, and make them familiar with the implementation of diplomacy.

INTR3009

World Energy Politics

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course explores the concept of energy and the role of energy policies in international relations. It also covers the energy market policies of Türkiye and other countries.

INTR3011 Crisis Management in Foreign Policy

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

In this course, it will be studied the foreign policy, decision-making process in foreign policy. This course will also handle with Concept of Crisis and Crisis Management in International Relations. Besides, it will be analysed the examples of crisis management.

INTR3015

Academic English - I

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

The students will be given lectures in the area of international relations by evaluating and examining various articles and publications in relevant areas.

INTR3013

Civil-Military Relations

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

The course includes the various subjects including military identity, theories of civil-military relations, military coups, coup-proofinf methods, the military's relations with war, democracy, development and gender as well as civil-military relations models in different regions

3. Sinif 2. Yariyil

INTR3000

Turkish Foreign Policy - II

3+0+0

ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

This course examines the evolution of Turkish foreign policy from the Cold War era to the present Beginning with Turkey?s strategic alignment with the West during the Cold War, the course explores

key events such as NATO membership, relations with the U.S. and the Soviet Union, and Turkey?s role in regional conflicts. It then analyzes the post-Cold War period, highlighting shifts in Turkey?s foreign policy behavior, the impact of globalization, the EU accession process, and the effects of 9/11 on security strategies. A significant focus is given to the Justice and Development Party (AKP) era, starting in 2002, which introduced new foreign policy concepts like proactive diplomacy, strategic depth, and regional engagement. The course covers Turkey?s relations with major global actors, including the U.S., Russia, NATO, and the EU, while also examining its growing influence in the Middle East, Africa, Asia and Latin America.

INTR3002 Turkey and European Union.

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

The course intends to provide BA students with the fundamental knowledge about the processes, institutions, different policies and the decision-making process of the European Union. Students should also be able to receive basic theoretical knowledge about European integration. Moreover, graduates from the course should receive fundamental information about the current state of EU- Georgian relations, as well as the perspectives of further integration. At the end of the course simulation game will be conducted, which will help students to employ the knowledge they have gained during the course in practical terms, as well as understand tough sides of the negotiation process. Topics used during the accession negotiation exercise will be related to Georgian problematique, which will help students realize the gaps existing between Georgian and European standards.

INTR3004

International Security

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course provides students a broad introduction to conventional and contemporary international security studies in international politics. It surveys some of the major concepts, theories and concepts in International Security Studies, through the exploration of series of empirical studies. It also includes an assessment of how main theories of IR provide insights into international security and the conditions for war and peace.

INTR3006 Dip. Writ. and Spea. Tech. İn English - II

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

Diplomatic Communication: This involves the rules of diplomatic writing and speaking, formal language usage, diplomatic style, and terminology. Protocol Rules: This covers the fundamental principles of diplomatic protocol, behavioral rules at official ceremonies, diplomatic visits, and reception procedures. International Relations: This includes international law, principles of international organizations, and diplomatic relations. Functioning of Diplomatic Missions: This entails the structure, responsibilities, and operations of consulates, embassies, and other diplomatic missions. Diplomatic Correspondence: This encompasses formal letter writing, diplomatic notes, reports, and preparation of other official documents.

INTR3012

State Society and Religion

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

It involves an in-depth exploration of the history, perspectives, actors, institutions and economic relationships as they relate to the environment in international relations. In particular, the first part of the course covers the conventional way of analyzing the causes of and cooperation on contemporary environmental challenges through the lenses of theories of international relations, and focuses on the main actors and processes of international environmental, climate, and sustainability politics as well as the most important principles and concepts. The second part of the course engages with strands of ecological approaches consisting of green political thought and the paradigms of sustainable development and renewable energy. The third part of the course will acquaint students with the relationships between environmental degradation and greater phenomena such as health, development, trade, and finance.

INTR3008

Cyber Security

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

The role of intelligence in IR, cybercrime, cyber-terrorism, and cyberwar.

INTR4008

Armenian Question

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

Scientific research and historiography: Different interpretations of the Armenian issue. The problem of denial and preconceived notions—its consequences: Political, legal, and moral debates. The Armenian diaspora and its activities.

INTR4001

Foreign Policy Analysis

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

The first part of the course will introduce the key actors, structures and processes of foreign policy. It will also discuss the main theories of decision-making and international politics. The second part of the course will deal with diplomacy, including public diplomacy, in terms of how it emerged and evolved.

INTR4003

Globalisation

3+0+0 ECTS:6

Contents of the Course

The term globalisation began to gain currency in the 1980s and became increasingly associated with various other processes ranging from modernisation and standardisation to concentration and mobility. Globalisation, however, tends to be studied as primarily an economic and technological process, sidelining its social, cultural, political, and ecological aspects. The course gives its audiences a broad, interdisciplinary introduction to key debates about globalisation as they have emerged since 1989. It analyses the complex ensemble of processes and discourses that operate under the term globalisation. The lecture starts with understanding definitions of globalization. It then proceeds with studying how globalisation has embedded in trade, finance, and position of labour in the world economy. The course ends with casting some light on the current debates around crisis of globalization and/or retreat from globalization. The course will also pay close attention to the ideas of Marxists, Post-Colonial critics, and Right-Wing populists in connection with their criticism directed at globalisation.

Contents of the Course

Current issues and themes such as war, security, sovereignty, world order, human rights, global political economy, migration, citizenship.

INTR4007

American Foreign Policy

3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

Contents of the course include theoretical approaches about American foreign policy, the historical and contemporary developments regarding the subject, the analysis of the decision-making structure and regional policies of the United States.

INTR4009

Eurasian Politics

3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course



The history of social, political, and economic transformation in post- Soviet Russia and Eurasia. Key challenges facing political, economic, and other social actors across sectors and topics in Russia and Eurasia today.

INTR4011

International Terrorism

Contents of the Course

Goals, strategies, and actions of international terrorist groups, the efforts of governments to confront and counter terrorism, and the effect of international terrorism on contemporary international relations.

Contents of the Course

This course focuses on contemporary debates about the meaning and nature of democracy and examines the idea of democracy from a range of historical, normative and theoretical perspectives. The course seeks to expose students both to some of the classic debates in the history of democratic thought and to some influential contemporary works in democratic theory. Throughout the course, we will discusse and compare several traditions within democratic theory which approach the meaning and nature of democracy differently.

INTR4002

Middle East Politics

3+0+0 AKTS:5

Contents of the Course

The politics, historical and contemporary developments in the Middle East region, the roots of some of the conflicts in the region, such as the Arab-Israeli conflict, the latest Arab revolutions, and the rise of Islamism, peace-making, nature of politics in the region together with the characteristics of state formation in the key countries, opposition movements, and the role of the religions.

This course considers the degree to which Turkish? political opinions and actions are influenced by the media as well as the influence of the media on public policy. Topics to be covered include history of the mass media, recent trends in the media, theories of media effects, the implications for politics of changes in media the ways in which the new shapes the public?s perceptions of the political world, campaign communication, how the media affect the manner in which public officials govern, and the general role of the media in the democratic process.

INTR4006 Graduation Project 3+0+0 ECTS:5

Contents of the Course

Preparing a report on a specific topic; writing literature review, methodology, results and discussion in a thesis format; presenting and defending the research findings before an audience

INTR4010 International Migration 3+0+0 ECTS:4

Contents of the Course

This course examines the phenomenon of migration within the framework of the discipline of IR. In this course, migration is analyzed in terms of its political, economic and socio-cultural dimensions. This course provides students with a basic understanding of the theoretical approaches to international migration as well as the legal framework regarding it.
